Instructive Tongue. The Attentive Ear is essential for listening to and following the instructions of the AED, while the Instructive Tongue is essential for teaching others how to perform C.P.R. and stay clear of the A.E.D. before it emits a charge.

The position of our hands when applying C.P.R. connects to the position of our hands on the Holy Bible, Square, and Compass during our obligation. Finally, completing C.P.R. training or knowing where to locate an A.E.D. in our Lodge relates to the lesson on coming to the aid of a Brother in their time of need. This can help to save a Brother's life in the event of a sudden cardiac arrest or loss of consciousness.


